

Part one specifics:

While classification is a major technical challenge in any export compliance program, the good news is regulators have provided a clear guide to the process that should be followed called the “Order of Review”. It seems simple enough in theory: Start with ITAR, look for specific listings, then look for “catch all” controls, then go to the EAR and do the same thing looking at 600 series and 500 series first. But hidden in this simple process are the intricacies of product types, technical requirements for releasing from catch all controls, intentionally specific definitions, and some intentionally vague definitions.
